Proposition 5 funds a permanent 120-bed shelter and re-housing hub on Reed Avenue — replacing a dangerous, asbestos-filled building that shelters only 52 people. City-owned.

Professionally operated. Step 1 of a proven plan to end homelessness in Norman for good.

20-year bond. City ownership unlocks \$30M-\$60M in federal & private matching funds.

► **These are Norman neighbors**

75% of Norman's unhoused grew up here or have strong local ties. This is our responsibility.

► **Proven models work**

Medicine Hat, Houston & Helsinki ended homelessness using this exact approach. Norman can too.

► **A re-housing hub, not a warehouse**

Day one: housing navigation, case management, job support, healthcare, and benefits enrollment.

► **Doing nothing costs more**

ER visits, police calls & encampment cleanups cost taxpayers far more than permanent solutions.
