The Plan Is Already Documented.

End Homelessness NORMAN responds to Nancy Ashton's thoughtful questions about the plan, the funding, and what needs to happen next — and why it needs to happen today.

Nancy — thank you. Genuinely. You exemplify why Norman voters are so engaged and always want to be informed with facts.

You are right that the City has identified \$140,000 in CDBG funds for homelessness planning — and we see that as an encouraging sign that The City of Norman, Mayor Holman, the City Council, and City Manager Pyle are beginning to move in the right direction. End Homelessness NORMAN's most urgent message to all of them is this: the time to begin building that coordinated system is today — not after the bond passes, not after the planning funds are allocated — today. Every day of

are waiting for a community organized enough to receive it.

The plan is not forthcoming from the City of Norman or City Manager Pyle as of yet, to my knowledge. That may change soon. However, the EHN plan is already documented — in detail — at EndHomelessnessNorman.org. The research, the proven models, the funding pathways, the wrap-around services framework — it is all there, freely available to every Norman citizen, every elected official, and every organization that wants to understand what is possible. I have personally delivered to Mayor Holman and the City Council specific grant names, filing dates, and dollar amounts. Norman's faith community has been contacted and encouraged to vote YES. And as we speak, End Homelessness NORMAN is reaching out to leaders around our country and globally to assist Mayor Holman, the City Council, City Manager Pyle, and the organizations already doing this work — the Salvation Army, Food & Shelter, the Share Center, and Norman's extraordinary faith community — in building something worthy of this city.

End Homelessness NORMAN welcomes questions from every concerned citizen. We are an open book. No question is too small. No concern is unwelcome.
